- ✓ The goal of the Festival is to foster excellence in the performance of music and to provide participants with awards and scholarships, encouraging them to continue their musical studies.

- ✓ The STARS OF THE FESTIVAL performance will be held on May 13th 2025. Further details will be announced in the Festival Program and on the LCMF website.
- Festival entry forms are available at van Goozen Music, Sarnia or can be filled in and printed on-line at www.lambtonmusicfest.org. One entry form is required for each class entered. Entries must be received by the Entries Secretary on or before by February 8th, 2025. Entry Forms can also be dropped off in person at van Goozen Music, 115 Mitton Street South, Sarnia during normal business hours before the February 8th deadline. Entries received after February 8th, 2025 will not be accepted (Rule 4-3). Only cheques and money orders will be accepted for entry fees. Canadian funds only please.
- Monetary awards will be payable to the competitor by cheque in Canadian Funds only.
- ✓ Competitors are responsible for entering the correct class. Under no circumstances will a competitor be allowed to change classes or the selection indicated for performance after the Entry Closing Date, February 8th, 2025, see Rule 4-3.
- ✓ Competitors and their teachers are expected to read and abide by the rules of the festival. If any of the rules are unclear, please contact one of the Festival Executive.

GENERAL RULES

1-FESTIVAL MANAGEMENT

- 1-1 The Festival shall be known as the Lambton County Music Festival.
- 1-2 The Festival is supported by members of the Ontario Music Festival Association.
- 1-3 Any question not dealt with in the rules, shall be referred to the Festival Executive. The decision of the Festival Executive on any point shall be final.
- 1-4 The members of the Festival Executive shall be elected annually at the general meeting. A nominating committee shall consist of the President, Past President, and Vice President(s), and/or appointees.

2 - ELIGIBILITY - DEFINITIONS

- 2-1 All competitions, except where otherwise stated, shall be open to amateurs only. For the purpose of these competitions, an amateur shall be deemed to be any person whose principal means of livelihood is derived from non-musical work, even if he or she, from time to time, accepts a stipend or honorarium for musical services rendered.
- 2-2 Classes are open to all without regard to residence or domicile. However, it should be noted that in certain classes there are awards provided which are only for competitors resident in specified localities.
- 2-3 Competitors in choirs, choral societies, orchestras and bands must be bona fide members of their respective organizations. In the case of school entries, members must have been registered at the school during the school year coinciding with the year of the Festival. Members of choirs, choral societies, orchestras, and bands may be professionals provided they comply with the terms of this rule.
- 2-4 Competitors are not allowed to perform for adjudication only.
- 2-5 Conductors may be either professional or amateur.
- 2-6 One conductor may conduct any number of choirs, choral societies, orchestras, or bands, either in the same class or otherwise. In the spirit of fair competition, vocal conductors are instructed not to sing with the choir during competition. Failure to comply could result in an adjudication penalty.

- 2-7 In each choir competing in Classes 1208 to 1225 inclusive, all members must be registered in the same classroom on the day of the competition. When more than one grade is present in the classroom, the grade with the larger number of students will be used to designate the class in which to compete.
- 2-8 In all classes in which an age limit is set, competitors must be at, or under the prescribed age on December 31st, 2024.
- 2-9 School choirs shall be limited to 75 members maximum.
- 2-10 Competitors may enter either the Age Designated Solo classes <u>or</u> the Graded Solo classes, but not both, except in duet classes.
- 2-11 Where there are changed voices, one of the parts may be doubled to accommodate the range of those changed voices.
- 2-12 Competitors may enter ONLY ONE Piano Quick Study Class.

3 - MUSIC SELECTION

- 3-1 Vocal and Choral pieces may be transposed. An original copy must be in the possession of accompanist at the performance.
- 3-2 Errors in notation should be identified on the original score and identified to the Adjudicator.
- 3-3 Where a specified edition or setting of the piece performed is indicated in the RCM or Conservatory Canada Syllabus, a copy thereof will be furnished to the Adjudicator. Competitors MUST use this setting or edition. Failure to comply with this will result in disqualification.
- 3-4 The competitor <u>must not</u> select a piece being performed by the same competitor elsewhere in this year's Lambton County Music Festival or performed by the same competitor at the Lambton County Music Festival in the past two years.
- 3-5 Competitors entering classes where the music titles are to be announced at time of performance need not state on the entry card which selection(s) they will perform, but must write the selection(s) they are performing on the back of the competitor's card and hand it to the Sessions Secretary upon arrival for their performance. Competitors should also refer to Rule 3-4.
 - Competitors should perform only one selection/movement unless otherwise indicated.

- b. Competitors entering classes which are to be announced at time of performance must hand an <u>original copy</u> of their music to the Sessions Secretary prior to their performance for use by the Adjudicator. Failure to do this may result in loss of marks or disqualification. An additional <u>original copy</u> of the music must be in the possession of the accompanist at the performance. Please also refer to Rule 9-3.
- 3-6 This rule applies to all classes except classes which are to be announced at time of performance, refer to Rule 3-5.
 - Competitors should perform only one selection/movement unless otherwise indicated.
 - b. The appropriateness of the selection to the age and grade will be considered by the Adjudicator in the evaluation of the performance, with the exception of the classes making use of the current Ontario Band Association Syllabus list.
 - c. The Entry Form MUST show the title, composer of the chosen piece <u>and</u> the TIME needed for the performance. Please use the back of the Entry Card if necessary.
 - d. The selection shown on the Entry Form MUST be the piece performed. Failure to comply with this will result in disqualification. An alternative selection will be accepted ONLY if a revised Entry Form plus another Entry Fee are in the hands of the Entries Secretary by the Entry Closing date, February 8th, 2025. No changes may be made after that date.
 - e. An <u>original</u> copy of the music to be performed must be submitted by each competitor to the Sessions Secretary prior to the performance for use by the Adjudicator. If an accompaniment is required, an additional original copy of the music must be in the possession of the accompanist. Please also refer to Rule 9-3.
 - Improvisation is not allowed, with the exception of the Concert Band and Jazz Ensemble classes.
 - g. See also Rule 3-4.
- 3-7 Do not play repeats unless specified in the Syllabus.

- 3-8 All solo music should be memorized. Should a competitor elect to use music during the competition, the Adjudicator has been instructed to deduct up to five marks from the total marks that would have been awarded for the performance (brass and woodwind are excluded).

 NOTE: Provincial Music Festival competitors at the Open level in all categories must perform from memory. Memory is not required for Brass, Woodwinds,
- 3-9 Accompaniment to Concerto classes must be played on a second piano.

and String Sonatas at the Diploma and Graded levels.

4 - ENTRIES

Competitors are responsible for entering the correct class. The Festival makes every reasonable effort to detect errors in Entry Forms and infractions of the rules. However, the ultimate responsibility for correctness of entries and adherence to the rules remain the responsibility of the competitor.

- 4-1 All Entry Forms must be signed indicating all rules governing entry have been complied with. This entry form must be signed on behalf of the competitor(s) by one person only, designating to whom all communications shall be addressed, and only one entry form should be forwarded. In the case of a choir, choral society, orchestra or band, the form should be signed by the Conductor, Secretary, or other qualified official.
- 4-2 a. The Executive reserves the right to reject any entry and reserves the right to refuse special scheduling requests.
 - b. Such requests must be made on a separate note stating the reason for your request and listing the numbers of all classes entered. Classes can not be moved to different times after programming has been completed.
- 4-3 All entries shall be sent in writing to the Entries Secretary on the form supplied, accompanied by the entry fee, on or before February 8th. Festival entries can also be dropped off in person to van Goozen Music during normal business hours. Entries received after February 8th, 2025 will not be accepted.
- 4-4 Entry fees are not refundable except in case of rejection of the entry by the Festival Executive.
- 4-5 Cheques and money orders are to be made payable to Lambton County Music Festival. **No cash will be accepted. Please note: Canadian Funds Only**
- 4-6 Copies of the Festival Syllabus and the Entry Form may be downloaded at www.lambtonmusicfest.org or obtained at van Goozen Music.

- 4-7 In all Piano Solo Classes, competitors must not enter classes more than one Level below their current level of study on the last day of the Festival. The Festival Executive strongly recommends all other competitors adhere to this rule also.
- 4-8 Under no circumstances will a competitor be allowed to change classes or the selection indicated for performance after the Entry Closing date, February 8th, 2025.
- 4-9 The Festival Executive reserves the right to cancel any class(es) if there are insufficient entries.
- 4-10 The Festival entry form can be found at www.lambtonmusicfest.org. The PDF form can be populated on-line and then printed.

5 - PROGRAM PROCEDURE

- 5-1 In the event of unusual circumstances, the Executive reserves the right to change or appoint additional Adjudicators.
- 5-2 After entering a class or classes, a Competitor's Form for each class entered will be returned to each competitor. The Competitor Form will duly set forth the place and time of the competition, and <u>must be brought to the festival</u> the day of the class competition and given to the Sessions Secretary when their class is called. The Sessions Secretary may disqualify any competitor who is not ready to compete within five minutes of being called.
- 5-3 Competitors must not commence until signalled to do so by the Adjudicator, who may also stop the performance at any time.
- 5-4 The Adjudicator, at their discretion, may select certain performers for a second hearing.
- 5-5 The Adjudicator will give such adjudication of each performance as they deem advisable following the conclusion of each class, but will announce the prize winner's marks only. Other contestants will be advised of their marks as noted in Rule 7-4.
- 5-6 The Festival Executive reserves the right to sub-divide any class into two or more competitions under circumstances where the number or character of the entries would justify such sub-division.
- 5-7 The name and order of performance of the contestants in each class will appear in the program and a copy of the same will be provided to the Adjudicator to facilitate adherence to the time schedule, and/or for personal notations and references.

- 5-8 a. When a piece is accompanied, each competitor must provide an accompanist. The accompanist must appear and perform with the competitor at the competition. The chord may be given at the piano at the commencement of each piece of unaccompanied music.
 - b. Only school choirs and classroom choirs may use a taped accompaniment. Competitors must provide their own audio equipment.
- 5-9 A person having any pupil or assistant competing except as a member of a choir or orchestra shall not be qualified to adjudicate in such competition.
- 5-10 In orchestra and band classes, the competitors will be allowed a period of three minutes to warm up and/or play a short preliminary selection of their own choosing. Should a preliminary selection exceed the three-minute limit, the competitor will be interrupted and requested to perform the test piece for the class.
- 5-11 Once the entry list is closed, the Executive will decide the order in which the classes will be scheduled, and will ballot for the order of competing. However, the Executive reserves the right to alter the order, if necessary, to suit competitors travelling from a distance. The order of competing will appear in the program. No altering of the class scheduled times will be allowed on the day of competition without authorization by the Executive.
- 5-12 No presentations other than those sanctioned by the Executive are permitted.

6 - ADMISSION AND DEPORTMENT OF COMPETITORS AND PUBLIC

- 6-1 The general admission of competitors to the hall in which the competitions are being held shall be governed by the Executive.
- 6-2 The competitions shall be open to the public.
- 6-3 No warmups or rehearsals will be permitted during the Festival in the competition halls. Band, Rhythm Band, Action Song and String classes may use the competition hall for warm ups or arranging of positions.
- 6-4 Silence is to be observed during performances and adjudications. Please silence all electronic devices
- 6-5 Competitors and/or their teachers or parents should not enter into any discussion or correspondence with an Adjudicator prior to or during the Festival unless it is initiated by the Adjudicator.

6-6 The Festival Executive requests that suitable stage attire and footwear should be worn. Deportment and appearance are important for a polished performance.

7 - MARKING

7-1 In order to preserve a high standard of performance, it shall be necessary in all competitive classes, except bands, for the performer(s) to obtain the following marks:

First Place	80 Percent or Higher
Second Place	75 Percent or Higher
Third Place	70 Percent or Higher

Band Marking as follows:

Gold Standard 85 Percent or Higher Silver Standard 80-84 Percent Bronze Standard 75-79 Percent

- 7-2 In action song classes and the show choir, the standard of marking will be 60% for singing and 40% for actions.
- 7-3 In classes where "Own Choice" is specified, the standard of the selection will be judged in the marking.
- 7-4 The Adjudicator's report including the marks awarded will be given to each competitor.
- 7-5 The Adjudicator's decision is final.

8 - AWARDS AND TROPHIES

- 8-1 In all classes, prize certificates will be awarded to First, Second and Third place competitors.
- 8-2 Should no candidate obtain a sufficiently high mark for a first prize certificate, the entry with the highest mark should be awarded a second prize certificate (provided the required standard is reached), the next highest being given a third prize certificate. In such a case, no award will be given to the third highest entry (See Rule 7-1).
- 8-3 In those classes in which trophies are awarded, the performance must receive at least the mark necessary for a first prize as indicated in Rule 7-1. The trophies may be held by the winners for nine months, i.e., until February 1st of the following year. The trophies are the property of the Lambton County Music Festival. The Trophies Convener must receive satisfactory assurance as

to the safe custody, return or replacement of the trophy to the Convener, by having a certificate signed by the competitor or conductor.

NOTE: The Festival will pay for any engraving charges provided they are completed by September 30th of the year they are awarded. After that date, the competitor is responsible for the cost of engraving. Instructions for engraving will be provided.

If more than two contestants tie for a trophy, the names of all winners will be inscribed thereon, but the trophy will remain in the possession of the Trophies Convener

- 8-4 Some awards will be made based on highest mark. To qualify for any award, the performance must receive at least the mark necessary for a first prize as indicated in Rule 7-1.
- 8-5 Some special awards will be given to competitors who show outstanding proficiency in their field of musical study. An award will not necessarily be made if the Adjudicator does not deem any contestant worthy of it. It is not necessary that the winner of an award be a prize winner but the performance must receive a mark of 80% or higher.
- 8-6 In all matters connected with prizes, the decision of the Festival Executive shall be final. Prize winners are encouraged to cash their awards cheque(s) promptly. Stale-dated cheques will not be reissued.
- 8-7 First prize winners may be invited to perform at the Stars of the Festival concert.

 The selection of performers for this concert is entirely at the discretion of the Executive.

9 - SPECIAL NOTES

- 9-1 Complaints and protests must be made in writing directly to the LCMF President at Box 772, Sarnia, Ontario N7T 7J7 no later than one month after the last day of the festival.
- 9-2 Competitors or directors requiring music stands shall be required to provide same for their own use, except in the case of bands.
- 9-3 Please <u>do not copy</u> any part or portion of music without authorization from the copyright owner. To do so is a violation of the Canadian Copyright Act and therefore illegal. Only <u>original</u>, <u>purchased</u> copies of music may be used. Sheet music purchased on-line can be used, but competitors must attach the purchase receipt to all copies. A purchased copy of the music to be performed must be provided to both the Adjudicator and any accompanist or conductor.

10 - THE PROVINCIAL MUSIC FESTIVAL OMFA

Competitors in vocal, piano, woodwind, brass, string, instrumental ensembles (3 to 5 performers), vocal ensembles (8 to 12 performers), junior and adult choirs and bands are eligible, on recommendation of the Adjudicator, to compete in the Provincial Finals. Competitors (except for adult choirs) must not be over age 28 on January 1st, 2025 and must meet certain criteria with regard to the selections performed.

A mark of 85 or greater must be received at the Lambton County Music Festival to be eligible for Adjudicator recommendation to the Provincial Finals. Students competing at Provincials for Repertoire competitions will be required to perform two or more pieces (depending on discipline) at the Grade Level in which they are competing. Choirs, Bands and Piano Concertos will be judged by audio/video recorded entries only.

Provincial Music Festival competitors at the Open level in all categories must perform from memory. Memory is not required for Brass, Woodwinds, and String Sonatas at the Diploma and Graded levels.

The 2025 Provincial Music Festival will be held via a combination of in-person and virtual competitions based on the classes entered. The in-person Provincial Festival will be held from June 9th to 14th, 2025 in the Kitchener-Waterloo region. Students are responsible for familiarizing themselves and following the OMFA General Rules and Syllabus information. Further information is available online at omfa.ca.

In addition to monetary awards given to all of the class winners, the Adjudicators can award a number of special monetary prizes to those performers showing outstanding proficiency in their field of study. Please note that all special awards are granted at the discretion of the adjudicators.

VOCAL SPECIAL AWARDS

THE FRANCIS FAMILY AWARD

\$750 Outstanding Promise in Intermediate or Senior Vocal

Competing in Classes 2300-2423, Does not include Duets or 15 and under classes

An award has been established in Memory of Lillian Wheatley Francis, A. C. Francis and Mary Lou Francis. The Francis family will award \$750 to a vocal student 16 years of age or older who is a resident of Lambton County and is enrolled in, or plans to enroll in, a full-time music program at the post-secondary level with a vocal major. To be eligible for this award the candidate must have a minimum of three years of private music study. This could include piano or other instrument as well as voice. The candidate must have entered the current festival in at least three solo vocal performance classes (not including musical theatre classes) and one vocal sight-reading class. The candidate must attain a first-class mark of 80 or above in the sight-reading class to be eligible for this award. This award may be received twice by any one competitor, but not in successive years.

Candidates who wish to be considered for this award must submit a letter with their festival entries outlining their music qualifications (i.e. years of study and with whom) and their present or future music education plans. If, in the Adjudicator's opinion, there is no worthy candidate, the award will not be made.

JEAN HARWOOD FAIRBANK AWARD

\$500 - Outstanding Promise in Senior Vocal

Competing in Classes 2400-2424

This award has been established by Charles and the late Sylvia Fairbank to be given, at the discretion of the Adjudicator, to a senior vocal student who is a resident of Lambton County.

LECKIE ROSE BOWL

\$200 - Overall Intermediate Vocal, 18 and Under

Competing in Classes 2300-2331, Solo classes only.

This award, donated by the Leckie family, will be given at the discretion of the Adjudicator to a competitor 18 years of age and under, for outstanding promise in solo Intermediate Vocal classes.

EYRE MEMORIAL FUND

\$100 - Overall Junior Vocal, 14 and Under

Competing in Classes 2200-2219

This award, donated by the Eyre family, will be given at the discretion of the Adjudicator to a competitor 14 years of age and under, for outstanding promise in Junior Vocal classes.

KEL-GOR LIMITED AWARD

\$100 - Overall Elementary Vocal, 9 and Under

Competing in Classes 2100-2109

This award, donated by KEL-GOR Limited, will be given at the discretion of the Adjudicator to a competitor 9 years of age and under, for outstanding promise in Elementary Vocal classes.

MARY BELLE HILLIER JUNIOR PIANO AWARD

\$200 - Overall Junior Piano, 14 and Under

Competing in Classes 3121-3124, 3200-3203, 3208-3211

This award, donated by Julie Hillier-Vrolyk will be given at the discretion of the Adjudicator to a competitor 14 and under for outstanding promise in Junior Piano classes.

MARY BELLE HILLIER INTERMEDIATE PIANO AWARD

\$200 - Overall Intermediate Piano, 18 and Under

Competing in Classes 3300-3302, 3309-3311, 3318-3321, 3322

This award, donated by Julie Hillier-Vrolyk will be given at the discretion of the Adjudicator to a competitor 18 and under for outstanding promise in Intermediate Piano classes.

CONNIE KENNEDY ELEMENTARY PIANO AWARD

\$75 - Elementary Piano, 11 and Under

This award, donated by the Sarnia Branch ORMTA will be given at the discretion of the Adjudicator to a Piano competitor 11 years of age or under playing at the Elementary Level.

CONNIE KENNEDY JUNIOR PIANO AWARD

\$75 - Overall Junior Piano, 14 and Under

Competing in Classes 3121-3124, 3200-3203, 3208-3211

This award, donated by the Sarnia Branch ORMTA will be given at the discretion of the Adjudicator to a competitor 14 and under for outstanding promise in Junior Piano classes.

CONNIE KENNEDY INTERMEDIATE PIANO AWARD

\$75 - Overall Intermediate Piano, 18 and Under

Competing in Classes 3300-3302, 3309-3311, 3318-3321, 3322

This award, donated by the Sarnia Branch ORMTA will be given at the discretion of the Adjudicator to a competitor 18 and under for outstanding promise in Intermediate Piano classes.

THE JOANNE THORNTON PIANO AWARD, LEVELS 4 AND 5

\$50 - Piano, Levels 4 and 5 Level

Competing in Classes 3200-3203, 3208-3211

This award will be given at the discretion of the Adjudicator to a Piano competitor playing at the Levels 4 or 5 Level.

THE MARGARET ALCOCK PIANO AWARD, LEVELS 6 AND 7

\$50 - Piano, Levels 6 and 7 Level

Competing in Classes 3300-3302, 3309-3311

This award will be given at the discretion of the Adjudicator to a Piano competitor playing at the Levels 6 or 7 Level.

THE JOANNE THORNTON PIANO AWARD, LEVEL 8

\$50 - Piano, Level 8 Level

Competing in Classes 3318-3326

This award will be given at the discretion of the Adjudicator to a Piano competitor playing at the Level 8 Level.

THE DONNA TAYLOR AND EDITE MOGENSEN SENIOR PIANO AWARD \$200 - Senior Piano, Open
